The appropriate copyright clearance code notice is to appear on the bottom of the first page of each paper according to the guidelines set forth in the Cataloging/Copyright Instructions for an IEEE Conference Proceeding. Detailed instructions can be found at: <https://www.ieee.org/publications/rights/index.html>

For papers in which all authors are employed by the US government, the copyright notice is: **U.S. Government work not protected by U.S. copyright**

For papers in which all authors are employed by a Crown government (UK, Canada, and Australia), the copyright notice is: **978-1-6654-6677-6/22/\$31.00 ©2022 Crown**

For papers in which all authors are employed by the European Union, the copyright notice is: **978-1-6654-6677-6/22/\$31.00 ©2022 European Union**

For all other papers the copyright notice is: **978-1-6654-6677-6/22/\$31.00 ©2022 IEEE**

How to insert Copyright Notice in your paper

Using Microsoft Word:

Insert the copyright notice in the footer of the first page instead of the footer already exists.
